The Department of Food Science and Human Nutrition (FSHN) at the University of Illinois seeks an expert in ingestive behaviors to fill a full-time 9-month (academic year) tenure track faculty position at the Assistant Professor level. The successful candidate will contribute to the FSHN Department's core areas of biochemical nutrition and integrated food, nutrition and health with growing strengths in eating behaviors, appetite regulation, and human intervention trials.

RESPONSIBILITIES: The successful candidate will establish and maintain an externally funded and independent research program focused on human eating behaviors that promote health and prevent disease and teach in related areas. Focus will be on genetic, neural and/or environmental factors that lead to choices about dietary intakes and their health-related outcomes. It is expected that discoveries will be translated into testable interventions for individuals, families and/or communities. This position will involve research, teaching and service obligations.

REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS: Candidates must have an earned doctorate in a discipline related to human nutrition. Evidence of professional promise and excellent interpersonal and communication skills are required. The University of Illinois conducts criminal background checks on all job candidates upon acceptance of a contingent offer. Final approval is given by the Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois.

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS: Postdoctoral training in social-behavioral sciences, neurosciences, ingestive behavior, prevention research or other related disciplines, ability to secure extramural funding, a strong publication record, ability to mentor students, experience in college-level teaching and engagement in professional associations are desired.

SALARY: Competitive salary with benefits and start-up package are commensurate with qualifications.

PROPOSED START DATE AND LOCATION: August 16, 2016; University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign.
